## DID YOU KNOW?



The triangle on plastics is not a recycling symbol. It is a code which plastic companies use to indicate which chemicals are in the plastic. The above symbol means that the product is made from Polyethylene-

terephthalate,  $(C_{10}H_8O_4)_n$ Bottles, fleeces & carpets are made of this material. PETE, or #1 plastic, earns Raven money. The plastic soda bottle that you drop off for a refund could be back in the territory within months as a new bottle or even a cosy fleece!

Triangle or not, all plastics are recyclable.
